The following is Resolution #48-2020 enacted by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbiana County, Ohio, hereinafter referred to as the Local Public Agency (LPA), in the matter of the stated described project.

WHEREAS, the historic Bowstring Arch bridge is currently serving as a pedestrian bridge on the Columbiana County Fairgrounds; and

WHEREAS, this rehabilitated and repurposed bridge is the only pedestrian access to the fairgrounds from the north side; and

WHEREAS, this bridge has become a beautiful attraction to the fairgrounds; and

WHEREAS, this bridge is one of the few remaining examples of this type of bridge, we, the Columbiana County Commissioners, are in agreement with the Columbiana County Engineer, Bert Dawson, that the proposed additional support under this bridge is necessary to provide the additional capacity in the event of an emergency situation, such as a natural disaster, where the bridge could potentially be overloaded.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Columbiana County Commissioners, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION ONE: The County Engineer of said LPA is hereby empowered on behalf of the LPA to prepare and execute an application for Transportation Alternatives Program for funds for the stated described project and to submit same to the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation.

SECTION TWO: The total construction cost of the project is estimated to be \$156,199.00, of which the LPA, if awarded the funds, commits to pay at least twenty (5%) percent (hereinafter known as the local portion) of the actual construction cost, estimated to be \$7,810.00. The local portion shall be funded by the LPA using Bridge Fund money. The LPA further agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the construction cost over and above the maximum amount provided by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation and for all costs associated with design, environmental and right-of-way activities.

SECTION THREE: Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal laws, including, but not limited to, 23 USC 116; (2) provide affinancial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described Project; (3) if necessary, maintain the right-of-way, keeping if free of obstructions; and (4) if necessary, hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.
