(2) Summary of Bank Reconciliations as of December 31, 2020

Depository Balances @ \$3.6 million and Investments total \$87.2 million
 Adding cash on hand of \$9 thousand the total amount of \$90.8 million agrees with the Auditor's Fund balance.

Note: There are 335 funds (General Fund only has \$5.2 million of the total figure)

- State Treasury Asset Reserve Account (STAR) @ \$16.9 million:
 - o (Yield @ 0.13% This has dropped from 1.81% in January)
- Star Plus Account @ \$2.3 million
 - o (Yield @ 0.10%)
 - We just received a notice that Star Plus will no longer be endorsed by the State Treasurer
 Managed by Stonebridge and then Meeder State Treasurer believes there are many
 products now so it does not make sense to endorse only one. We will move this money
 back to Star and review to see if we can purchase a higher yield product.
- Money market accounts Covid-19 funds @ \$1.9 million/Huntington MMAX \$59,000 and Premier Bank at \$3.1 million
- Certificate of Deposit CF Bank @225,000
- Portfolio with Meeder/UACC \$61.5 million
 - Detail of specific investments can be found in the advisor's report but to summarize:
 - Commercial Paper @ \$5.2 million
 - Non-callable Federal Agency @ 18.9 million
 - Corporate Medium-Term Notes (MTN) @ \$1.0 million (Toyota) able to choose from differing maturities,
 - Negotiable CD's @ 9.6 million (guaranteed by the bank can be sold on secondary market but are held until maturity)
 - Callable Federal Agencies @ 23.7 million
 - Treasuries @ 975,000
 - Step-up Callable @ 350,000 (interest rate can increase over the life of the investment)
 - Municipal Bonds @ \$850,000

- We earned \$1,133,000 in interest income and have realized gains of \$147 thousand. Our average yield to maturity is 0.990%.
