He stated Commissioner Weigle has worked hard over the past year in regard to the violations.

Commissioner Halleck also informed the Board that Senator Sherrod Brown has been in contact with him regarding the COVID monies and what it can be used for. The Board has had several project requests from a Bear Cat, a Morgue, a Storage Building, a Lift Station, Microfilm documents, Parking Lot, Software Upgrade, Weights & Measures Truck, to name a few. There are a host of projects we want to do, but that all depends on what the money can be used for. He appreciates Senator Brown, Senator Bill Johnson and Representative Tim Ginter for paying attention to our needs.

Commissioner Halleck stated Encino Energy wants to do something for our County and will be furnishing food for the volunteers and workers at the Fairground COVID Building today and Friday and also the same days next week. He has talked with the CFO of Encino Energy and they may possibly be drilling in the southwest part of the County in the near future.
