RE: INVESTMENT ADVISORY BOARD MEETING

Commissioner Halleck called the Investment Advisory Board to order.

Roll Call by the Clerk:

Commissioner Halleck, Commissioner Paparodis, Commissioner Weigle, Clerk of Court Tony Dattilio, Treasurer Blakeman and Jim McCourt of Meeder are present. Quorum established.

Jim McCourt of Meeder presented the County Investment Strategy Update dated July 20, 2022 and briefed the committee on the investments for the County. The interest rates have continued to rise since the last quarter and based on the market, we are heading into a recession if we're not already there, depending on the data that comes in. The trend is moving up on our investments as inflation remains elevated. The liquid cash available and the investment amounts have increased 20% since the last quarter. Treasurer Blakeman stated he has moved 9 million in the last 6 months in investments and the way the market is now, the moves we made in the past are paying off. Although the county debt is down considerably since last year, discussion on the status of the sales tax revenue for the county is a concern and more funds may need to be made available if it continues to decline.
